Despite the adversity of finding my purpose in this big wide world, I finally found my home in the community of Houston creatives, and through this community of writers, poets, and educators, I've discovered a passion for nurturing creativity in the voices of young writers. Ultimately, I aspire to be the creative support I yearned for when I was the same age as my students.

Leading writing workshops at Alief Montessori Community School has been an incredible experience—in all aspects from the moment I step on campus. My class consists of 26 immensely talented students, each with a rich and unique story of their own. Black History Month: A time to A.C.T.

February is Black History Month, a federally recognized annual celebration of the rich cultural heritage of African Americans, and a time to recognize the many contributions and sacrifices they made that helped shape the United States. This celebration originated in 1926 by historian and educator Carter G. Woodson, the first person born to enslaved parents to graduate from Harvard University. While Black History Month began as a week-long celebration, it was expanded to the full month of February in 1976 by President Gerald Ford. Woodson chose February to honor the birthdays of prolific writer, orator, and abolitionist Frederick Douglas (whose exact birthday is unknown), and President Abraham Lincoln, who signed the Emancipation Proclamation that abolished slavery in the confederate states.

Black History Month is a time to celebrate art, culture, and innovation, while respectfully honoring those who endured unthinkable hardship imposed through slavery, Jim Crow, systematic oppression, and racism. Though it is important to engage critically about these topics, it is just as important to remember Black history doesn't begin with slavery or end with the Civil Rights Movement. While slavery and the Civil Rights Movement may be the most recognizable subjects to begin and end Black History Month, Carter Woodson advocated to connect students with the history of significant African civilizations and their many accomplishments to world history.

Honoring and celebrating Black History Month is for everyone, no matter their race. Black History is American History. I encourage you to make a commitment to A.C.T (/ak(t)/ verb. take action; do something) in honor of Black History Month.
